Digitalisation promotes customer benefits

This spring, Steeltech has been working on the project Digiresan IUC West*. Together with Combitech, the focus has been to review the digitisation process in warehouses and other stock-keeping spaces. The aim has been to achieve safer and faster deliveries.

Combitech's task was first to carry out an analysis and then to present recommendations for new measures – including starting points for the continued digitalisation of our organisation.

“Today, we are far from fully digitalised. The purpose of this effort is to further develop our digitisation work and get ahead of the market,” says Johan Löfgren, Production Planner at

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Steeltech and in this case also Project Manager.

Initially, the focus has been on warehouses and other storage spaces. Our target is to have total control of all received goods and materials. This will improve efficiency, including identification of warehouse storage, and will secure safer and faster deliveries across Steeltech's operations. This part of the project will be completed and put in place during the third quarter of this year.

After this, the next development phase will focus on freight reception and invoice processing.

"We are continuously working on improving our work with digitisation," says Sara Lindgren, Purchasing Manager at Steeltech.

"A good example of this is this very project, but we are also working in the field with clients and we are busy performing benchmarking at other companies in the industry." Additionally, we are working closely with the supplier of our Monitor business system to further digitalise all flows in our business.

We are sure we will hear more about Steeltech's current digitalisation process in the future.
